BACKGROUND:

Hope and Peace for Humanity (HPH) is a registered Community Based Organisation (CBO) founded by highly committed and motivated volunteers to contribute towards a process of restoring hope, improving the quality of life of persons in post conflict communities of Northern Uganda particularly those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS (PHAs), Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC), single child mothers, formerly abducted persons and Extremely Vulnerable Individuals (EVIs) through Health promotion, Education, Economic Empowerment, Food Security and Peace Building for a sustainable development for self reliance.

VISION:

A Socio-economically empowered, Peaceful, Healthy, and Hopeful community with persons whose rights are recognised and upheld.

MISSION STATEMENT:

We work towards empowering people infected and affected by HIV/AIDS in Northern Uganda to take better control of their social and economic lives by ensuring their active participation in development activities

GENERAL GOAL:

To reduce the impact and spread of HIV/AIDS by promoting awareness and the overall wellbeing of people through increasing access to health care, education, economic empowerment and peace building for self-reliance.

STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES:-

1. To increase health promotion/education and reduce incidences of HIV and AIDS amongst local population in Northern Uganda.
2. To support access to quality OVC education through sponsorships and school supports.
3. To promote livelihood & food security for economic independence and self sustainability.
4. To promote gender empowerment and peace building in Northern Uganda.

Currently HPH activity implementation is in the post conflict district of Gulu, Northern Uganda with prospect of expanding to other parts of the region. This we expect to achieve with support and funding from well wishers and friends.

HPH implements their programmes through the coordination of departmental activities and these include Livelihood, Health, Justice and Peace, and Education departments as bellow.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT

- ✦ Community awareness, Mobilisation and Sensitisation on HIV/AIDS and other epidemics.
- ✦ Provision of Care and Support for PHAs at physical, psychological, spiritual and social aspects of human life.
- ✦ Provision of a comprehensive Home Based Care services (HBC, & PMTCT services)
- ✦ Provision of low cost housing to the vulnerable (PHAs, PWDs, women, Elderly and OVCs)
- ✦ Routine outreach programmes on HIV/AIDS preventive measures and Behavioural change programmes especially in schools, institutions, prisons, police and army barracks.

LIVELIHOOD DEPARTMENT

- ✦ Capacity building and training programmes for the vulnerable on agricultural production (food security), Income Generating Activities (IGAs) for economic empowerment.
- ✦ Supportive counselling, (clients), guidance and counselling (OVCs).
- ✦ Advocacy on culturally acceptable norms on Human rights and SGBV and PLWHAs.
- ✦ Provision of trainings in farming as a business and Start and improve your business (SIYB) programmes
- ✦ entrepreneurship business skills training, mentorship and social accountability leadership training.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT

- ✦ Provision of life skill trainings to in-school and out-of-school youths.
- ✦ Provision scholastic materials and sponsorships to OVCs.
- ✦ Supply of sanitary packs for in-school girls

- ✦ Construction and stocking of libraries for rural schools
- ✦ Support for vocational skills trainings to encourage practical skills.
- ✦ Provision of career guidance and counselling for life skills development.
- ✦ Formation of child rights clubs in learning institutions.

JUSTICE AND PEACE DEPARTMENT

- ✦ To promote peace building activities in Northern Uganda beginning with an individual, to family, community and nation as a whole.
- ✦ To discourage the feelings of revenge amongst the population in Northern and encourage coexistence.
- ✦ To promote human rights of the vulnerable and advocate for respect of rights for all.
- ✦ IEC/BCC material development & dissemination.
- ✦ Cultural & institutional trainings on peace & conflict mediations.
- ✦ Formation of peace youth clubs in schools & colleges, child/human rights advocacies.

VOLUNTEERISM

Volunteers play significant roles in development programmes thus HPH promotes community volunteerism through skills and experience sharing. The students (Senior 4 & 6 holiday students, University interns and graduates not in employment & other tertiary institution students are given opportunities to take leading roles in community development works. This also applies to community stakeholders to take part in community work that equips them with practical skills for sustainable socioeconomic development. International volunteers are also encouraged to come and empower minds and hearts to change the community they will choose to work with.

SOURCES OF FUNDINGS

HPH shall obtain its funds from Fundraising/Lobbying, friends & well wishers. The organization shall have powers to obtain, lobby and receive its finances from:-

- a) Membership fees and subscriptions as shall be determined from time to time by the founding members and well wishers.
- b) Donations, grants and gifts from Local, National and International sources.
- c) Proposal & concepts development and supports.
- d) Any other means of fundraising or sources approved by HPH which are legally accepted by the constitutional laws of the country (UGANDA).

FUTURE PLANS;

- ✦ Expand programme activities to other districts of Northern Uganda in the Acholi sub region.
- ✦ Start a comprehensive & integrated youth Alcoholism, drug control & rehabilitation programme.
- ✦ Establish and Set up a community youth training & resource centre in Gulu and Lamwo districts equipped with computers, internet and communication facilities for global village networking etc.
- ✦ establishing and developing net partnerships and collaborations with other development partners with shared vision
- ✦ Integrate maternal and reproductive health programmes in the operational areas.
- ✦ Promote stronger justice and human rights advocacy programmes in the Northern Ugandan region.
- ✦ Increase gender mainstreaming roles and education for OVCs and Promote housing construction to extremely vulnerable individuals (child headed households,

disabled persons, grandmother caretakers of children).

- ✦ Increase public health education including HIV and AIDS prevention, treatment, care and support.
- ✦ Promote increased peace building & conflict mediation/management using the culturally acceptable structures.
